Until the 1800s, **oak savanna and prairie** covered the hills surrounding Indian Lake. Only a few patches of prairie now remain. Today, you can **hike, run, cross-country ski, walk your dog, fish, or picnic** in this magnificent setting. The Friends of Indian Lake County Park is dedicated to working with Dane County Parks to **restore the native landscape** in the park.

Projects and activities include:

- :: Prairie and woodland restoration
- :: Restoration of Indian Lake's fishery
- :: Trail maintenance and building
- :: Capital projects such as a well and interpretive park exhibits
- :: Trail and showshoe runs
- :: Nature hikes
- :: Chapel maintenance
